1. About the school

Satya Bharti Adarsh Senior Secondary School, Rauni, is a part of the larger Satya Bharti School Program run by the Bharti Airtel Foundation. This initiative was launched with a powerful goal — to provide free, quality education to children from underprivileged backgrounds. It was created to meet the growing need for complete schooling from kindergarten to class 12 (K-12), helping children gain the knowledge and skills they need to become responsible and employable citizens in the future.

The school emphasizes the overall development of students. Along with strong academic support, it also offers vocational training to help students prepare for real-world careers. Affiliated with the CBSE, New Delhi, this school is one of five senior secondary schools operating in collaboration with the Punjab Government under the Adarsh Scheme. The aim is to bridge learning gaps and ensure students are well-prepared in both academics and practical skills. Facilities like science labs, libraries, sports equipment, and teacher training programs support this holistic approach to education.

Located in the village of Rauni, near the Khanna-Malerkotla Road in Ludhiana district (Punjab), the school has transformed the local education landscape. While the area had access to free and compulsory education, quality schooling was still out of reach for many families — until the Satya Bharti schools were established. Initially starting with primary schools, the growing demand for continued education led to the opening of this senior secondary school. For many in the community, the school became a symbol of hope and opportunity.

What started as a modest English-medium school with basic facilities has now become a beacon of change. The school is known for its positive impact, with a focus on developing students in every aspect — academic, moral, social, and vocational. Today, the school serves around 1221 students from 45 surrounding villages, including four Satya Bharti schools, with 52.74% girls and 38% from the SC/ST/OBC category. Most of these students come from families of marginal farmers, small traders, daily wage earners, and are often the first in their families to receive formal education.

1.1 School as a space of expression, creativity, and joyful learning

Satya Bharti Adarsh Senior Secondary School is more than just a place to study — it's a space where students are free to express themselves, explore their creativity, and truly enjoy the process of learning. Here, education goes beyond textbooks. Children are encouraged to ask questions, share ideas, and take part in activities that make learning exciting and meaningful.

To nurture creativity and critical thinking, the school regularly organizes a wide range of initiatives such as art competitions, essay writing contests, Olympiads, and even robotics competitions. Sahodaya Competitions having 3171 entries are there in various competitions. These activities give students the platform to showcase their talents, challenge themselves, and develop new skills. Whether it's through painting, writing, solving complex problems, or building innovative models, students are inspired to think differently and grow confidently.

Satya Bharti Adarsh Sr Sec School is a place where learning feels like discovery, and every day brings new opportunities for joyful exploration and self-expression.

1.2 Curriculum aligned with National Curriculum Framework

At Satya Bharti Schools, we believe that every child is unique and full of potential. That’s why our approach to education is child-centric, holistic, and deeply rooted in values. We aim to make learning meaningful, joyful, and connected to real life—something that truly speaks to each child’s world.

Our curriculum brings together the best teaching practices from across the country. It’s built on the National Curriculum Framework (NCF) 2005, which means it’s well-aligned with CBSE and state board guidelines. But more importantly, it goes beyond textbooks and exams—focusing on helping children grow in all areas of life.

We’re also moving forward with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which reimagines how learning should happen in today’s world. One big change is the introduction of the new 5+3+3+4 structure, which focuses more on how children actually grow and learn at different stages. As part of this, we’ve started LKG and UKG classes, giving our youngest learners a strong, joyful foundation right from the start. Our classrooms are becoming more inclusive, more engaging, and more focused on building future-ready skills—while still holding on to the core values of equality, inclusion, and diversity that are part of our country’s soul.

At the heart of it all, we want our students to grow into not just successful individuals, but thoughtful, compassionate, and responsible citizens—ready to shape a better tomorrow.

Teachers thoughtfully create lesson plans that actively engage students and promote hands-on, participatory learning experiences.

One of the key initiatives in this direction was the **Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) program**, implemented for students from Classes I to VIII. The program was rolled out in three phases — **Baseline, Midline, and Endline** — to track students’ progress over time in both literacy and numeracy.

The FLN program aimed to strengthen basic skills such as reading, comprehension, writing, number recognition, and simple arithmetic operations. Students were assessed at various levels of difficulty in both **Language** and **Mathematics**. In Language, these included stages like Beginner & Letter level, Word level, Paragraph reading with comprehension, and Story reading with comprehension. In Mathematics, the focus was on skills like recognizing single and two-digit numbers, as well as performing basic subtraction and division.

This structured approach not only helped improve foundational skills but also offered clear insights into students’ learning achievements throughout the academic year.

1.3 Technology Integration in Learning Process

As the significance of robotics grows in the global academic sphere, our Satya Bharti School boasts a well-established Robotic Lab. Robotics offers children invaluable opportunities for learning and growth, introducing them to Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) concepts in a practical and engaging way. The students of Classes 4 to 10 take benefit of Robotics Lab and participate in different competitions. This helps our students develop essential skills, including:

ICR (Interactive Classroom System) Projectors

Our school is equipped with ICR projectors, which enable our teachers to try new techniques and cater to various learning styles. Explaining concepts in multiple ways helps solidify information and engrain it deeper for higher understanding.

VIRTUAL LAB

Our Science lab is equipped with projectors that display virtual lab simulations, allowing students to conduct experiments and investigations in a virtual environment. This technology also enables the display of live experiments, enabling students to observe and analyze scientific phenomena in real-time.

TAB LAB

Our school is equipped with Tablab having 44 Tablets in it and this is for classes 6 to 8. Students use Tablab for the subject Maths and Science. This technology enables students to understand the concept easily and they can analyse their learning levels and have remedial in it itself. This is a great experience for the students and to create interest, creativity & innovation in them.

1.4 Innovative Teaching Learning Material (TLM)

The school utilizes a variety of Teaching-Learning Materials (TLMs) to aid the teaching-learning process. Teachers are encouraged and rewarded to innovate different TLMs for various levels of students. The school employs various TLMs, including Jodo Gyan, mathematics park - teaching aid for mathematics, geometrical kit, science kits, and interactive TLMs like IBB (Interactive Bulletin Boards), self-correcting cards, and hands-on practicals in labs under the guidance of expert teachers. Subject specific TLMs are used by the teachers according to the syllabus. Also, the Interactive learning teaching material like jaduai pitara, phonics kit etc are available for the classes LKG to II. Teachers are using these TLMs to build the concepts and also students have hands-on experience with TLMs for better understanding and for long term retention. TLM Mela was organized at School Level and 8 winners at School level were awarded with certificates.

1.5 . Focus on English and Computer Education

The school is dedicated to building strong English and computer skills in students right from the early years. **Computer education starts as early as Class I**, and even younger students in Pre-Primary and Lower Primary classes take part in fun, hands-on lab activities designed to develop their listening abilities and basic digital skills. The program is guided by **qualified and experienced computer teachers**, ensuring students receive the right support and encouragement as they begin their digital learning journey. To make language learning more fun, interactive, and impactful, the school has introduced a **state-of-the-art Language Lab** equipped with **Wordsworth software**. This dedicated space allows students to go beyond traditional classroom learning by engaging in hands-on activities that enhance their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. The lab creates an environment where students actively participate in language exercises, boosting their confidence and fluency.

Although English is already the medium of instruction, we take it a step further by promoting the language through **creative, real-life, and meaningful activities**—both in the Language Lab and across day-to-day learning. This well-rounded approach helps students build strong communication skills that support their academic growth and prepare them for future opportunities.

One of the standout achievements this year was the **remarkable improvement in Class X board results**, which reflected the positive impact of the Language Lab. The structured LSRW program benefited all learners, including those from lower-performing sections, who showed clear progress in their language proficiency. The consistent use of the lab has been instrumental in building students' self-assurance and ability to express themselves effectively.

1.6 . Co-Curricular Activities

At our school, education goes far beyond textbooks. Along with academic learning, we place a strong focus on the holistic development of every child. To support this, we offer a wide range of co-curricular activities that spark creativity, build confidence, and nurture important life skills. Students take part in fun and meaningful activities related to art, science, math, language, general knowledge, and sports—all planned and shared in a monthly memo. These activities give students the chance to express their ideas through drawing, writing, and creative projects, often centered around important celebration days and real-world themes like the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). We also encourage students to showcase their talents in both internal and external competitions, including Literary Fest, Math Magic, SEC (School Enterprises Challenge), INSPIRE Manak Awards, Expression Series, Budding Author Contests, Art Competitions, Read India Celebration, My gov. App quizzes, Sahodaya Competitions and many more. These experiences help our students develop essential 21st-century skills—like critical thinking, communication, collaboration, and creativity—that prepare them not just for exams, but for life.

At our school, we believe in preparing students not just for exams, but for real-life careers. That's why we offer vocational education—a practical, hands-on approach to learning that helps students build skills for specific jobs and industries.

Vocational training focuses on real-world experience rather than just theory. At our school, students can choose from courses like Beauty and Retail, where they learn useful, job-ready skills. To make learning even more meaningful, we also organize industrial visits, giving students a chance to see how things work in professional settings and connect classroom learning to real-world applications.

This approach helps students become more confident, skilled, and career-ready, opening doors to opportunities after school. Last year, our students visited:

- Beauty Salons and Academy to learn practical tips from experts in the beauty industry
- Smart Bazaars, shopping Malls to gain vocational knowledge in retail, where they interacted with salespersons and customers.

In the whole session, 4 industrial visits of beauty & wellness and 10 industrial visits of Retail Management were organized. Additionally, our school organizes 3 guest lectures of Retail Management and 2 guest lectures of Beauty & wellness sectors.

Pre- Vocational Modules were introduced for classes 6 to 8, financial literacy for class 6, Coding for class 7 and Marketing for class 8. During the Bagless Days, these were implemented and the activities of these modules were conducted by the teachers. Students participate in different activities of these modules and learn about the different skills.

5.1 Class X results- 2024-25 Sr. Sec Rauni

Please find below the performance of our students in the CBSE Class X 2024-25 Board Exam.

82 students (45 Girls & 37 Boys) took the exam.

Key highlights

- Pass percentage is **97.5%** (LY 97.9%).
- Girls Pass percentage is **100%** (LY 100%).
- **Of the total 80 students (who passed):**
 - a) 19 students 23.8 % (LY 19.4 %) are in A1 and A2 categories (>80%) . Of these 14 are girls.
 - b) 4 student 5.0% scored 90% and above (LY 2.2 %). Of these, 4 are girls.
 - c) 23.8% students scored less than 60% (LY 40.9%).
 - d) **Subject-wise Highest Marks** : English (90), Math (100), Science (87), Social Studies (87), Punjabi (98), Retail (95), Beauty and Wellness (100)
 - e) **Highest marks 472 out of 500 (94.40%).**

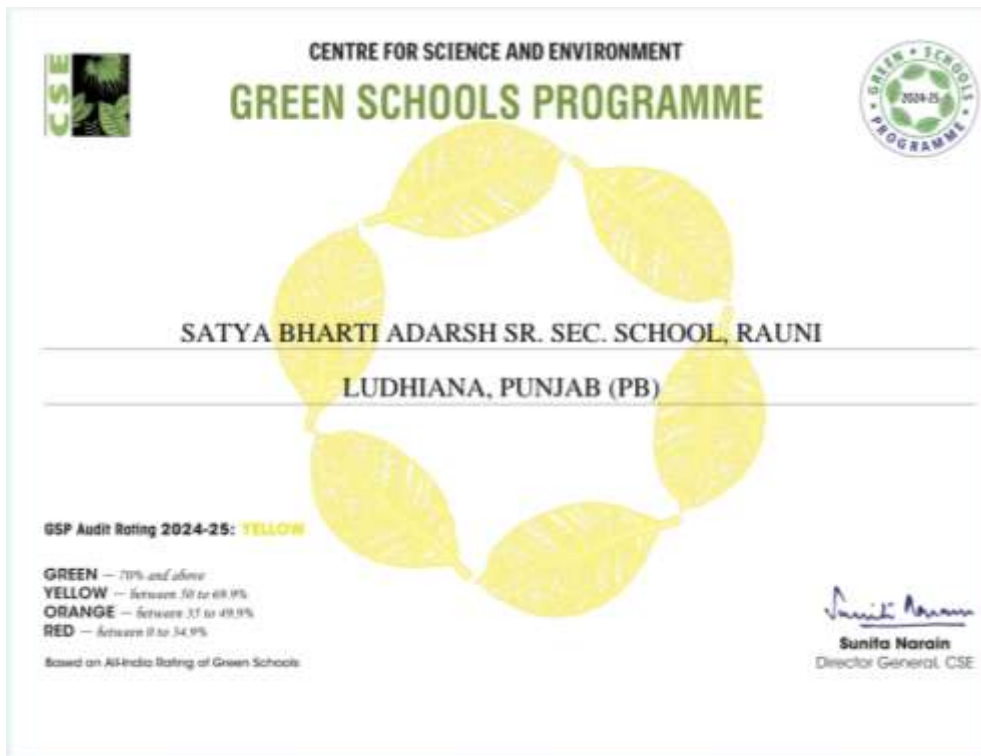
